THE APPLICATION

Mark & Paulette BROWNE ("the licensee") applies for an on-site Special Licence in respect of premises situated at Main Road, Hari Hari known as the "Hari Hari Community Hall."

The licence is to host the 75th Jubilee of the Woodham Shield in the hall after the annual sports day. It is estimated that up to 150 people will attend the event.

Substantive food and low alcohol and non-alcoholic beverages will be available at all times, and a certificated manager will oversee the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol.

The day and hours sought are:

Sunday 3 August 2025

3.30pm to 10.00pm.

THE REASONS FOR THE DECISON

The Inspector has provided a report on the application and believes the application meets the criteria for issue.

Three experienced certificated managers will be overseeing the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol.

Neither of the final reports of the Police nor that of the Medical Officer of Health raises any matters in opposition.

Overall, I am satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act.

DECISION

The District Licensing Committee, pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 grants the application by Mark & Paulette BROWNE ("the licensee") for an on-site Special Licence in respect of premises situated at Main Road, Hari Hari known as "Hari Hari Community Hall" subject to conditions.

Conditions:

The licence is subject to the following conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold and supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours:

Sunday 3 August 2025 3.30pm to 10.00pm.

- 2. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.
- 3. A certificated manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol;
- 4. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations of a similar range and standard.

- 5. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of low-alcohol and non-alcoholic beverages.
- 6. The Licensee must display signage as follows:
 - a)At every point-of-sale detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons:
 - b)A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises; and
 - c) A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.
- 7. The licensee must provide information and advice about forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises including the courtesy van.
- 8. No BYO alcohol is permitted to be brought into the hall. Signage must be displayed advising that no alcohol is to be brought into the hall, or taken away.
