HOKITIKA BEACHFRONT DEVELOPMENT

Sunset Point Parking

- New location found to avoid conflicts with existing users. Similar parking area planned for new Beach Street location.
- Concept plan has been developed and construction documentation is being developed for tendering.

Beach access (End of Weld Lane) TIF Funded

- Site plan developed
- Alternative design being developed for ramp access, due to high costs for original proposal. Staff are liaising with different contractors to find the best solution.
- Both sets of work will be scheduled to align the construction.



WADESON ISLAND DEVELOPMENT

Overview

 This project is a collaboration between Westland District Council, Department of Conservation, West Coast Regional Council and local iwi. Westland district councils current involvement at the moment and to date has been part of the consultation team, that has helped develop the concept plan.

Dog Park

 Council has allocated funds for the establishment of a dog park. This work is straight forward but council will wait until the stakeholders are agreed and a priority work plan developed before constructing the dog park. This work will likely be carried over into the next financial year.



LEISURE SERVICES

Hokitika Lighting

- Upgrades to the Tambo lighting have been completed and are now operational. The original Tambo anchor has been re-installed.
- Heritage area lighting has been installed
- Weld Lane fairy lights have been extended
- New Poles for lights and banners on Weld Street have been installed
- Carnegie building lighting has been ordered.
- Pioneer statue lighting has been ordered.
- Clock tower lighting concept is being redesigned to avoid interfering with the structure of the clock.
- Flag trax have been installed

Pakiwaitara Project

Pakiwaitara Building project is in the early stages.

- Initial Architects concept imagery and documentation is in progress with Dalman Architects
- Weatherproofing is being managed by the maintenance team.
- Initial brief discussions are in progress with the Westland District Library and other stakeholders involved.

LEISURE SERVICES Hokitika Swimming Pool

Hokitika Swimming Pool has begun:

- Stage One of the Swimming pool project has been completed by the main contractor Evan Jones Construction and multiple sub trades.
- Crucial structural strengthening works completed have increased the main building's (National Building standards) NBS rating to above 67%. New developments can now begin as a part of the stage two works.
- Design for the stage two refurbishment works is now 90% completed, allowed with in the project program to commence within the new year.
- Destination Westland the operational managers of the facility are currently operating the pool as per normal and will close down for the annual shut down period this winter.



Carnegie Building

Carnegie Building project is near completion.

- Trademark Construction have successfully completed 80% of the work involved with the restoration of the Carnegie building.
- Current works include the restoration of the exterior parapets. The exterior of the building has also been covered in scaffolding to allow the entire building to be cleaned and broken windows replaced.
- Due to the most recent Covid lockdown delays have been experienced, which has caused the crew to be 30 days behind schedule. The new completion date is now estimated to be early March 2022



TOWN HALLS

All town halls are progressing well and will be complete by the end of the financial year





Bruce Bay Hall

Update on Bruce Bay Hall:

- Building consent issued the week before Christmas.
- Local builder unavailable to start until March.

Waitaha Hall

Update on Waitaha Hall:

- Re-pile complete
- Exterior has been washed and roofing repairs complete
- Bathroom partially complete, waiting on painter
- East wall being repaired after rot was found when selectively replacing cladding.

Grey Power Building

Update on Grey Power Building:

- Building is complete, except for exterior painting being underway currently
- Exterior sliding door also being replaced.



Hokitika Band Hall

Update on Hokitika Band Hall:

- Engineering work requested as part of BC RFI will put the job over budget. Bc has been withdrawn
- Non consentable work to start in February



TOWN HALLS

All town halls are progressing well and will be complete by the end of the financial year

Kumara Hall

Update on Kumara Hall:

- Completed Insulation and electrical work
- Plugged and concreted a historic mine shaft under the South East corner of the building.
- Geotechnical report confirmed needing to re-pile under the West wall, where the foundation has tipped, is viable.

Haast Hall

Update on Haast Hall:

- Roofing expected to be complete by mid February
- Structural design complete. Need to apply for a building consent. The Hall is the primary welfare center in Haast and, at IL4, has been assessed at 36% NBS. The changes will bring it to 67% of NBS at IL4.



Kokatahi Hall

Update on Kokatahi Hall:

- All works originally in scope of works have been completed.
- Matt Fairmaid Builders Ltd are working with committee and project manager on nonconsentable improvements for balance of budget.



Okuru Hall

Update on Okuru Hall:

- Re-piling complete
- Two rafters which were not directly supported now levelled and a new wall in place.
- Waiting on contractors to move forward with the bathroom and kitchen



JACKSON BAY WHARF

- Allocated budget has been fully utilised and tasks completed that fit within this budget included:
 - Causeway from land to wharf
 - Main structural pile on wharf proper replaced
- Remaining work to be completed (outside of allocated budget)
 - Entire wharf upgrade
 - Wharf lower deck

Westland Footpaths:

Project budget: \$300,000

Cron Street carparks and extension:

The Cron Street extension and carpark is near completion with the final basecourse placement and shaping being carried out for the extension prior to chip sealing of the entire project. The final completion date has been extended out to 28 February as a result of bad weather delays prior to Christmas.

2021/2022 Westland footpaths scope of works:

The 21/22 Footpath programme has been sent to contractors to schedule. We are awaiting a programme start date from the contractors but aim to complete the works before end of financial year.

Approximately 4.3km of footpaths across the district are to be replaced or repaired. Four grate pedestrian crossings to be installed as an outcome of the LTP consultation. Tactile Indicators are also to be installed for the first time in Hokitika following consultation with Blind Low Vision NZ.

Project Budget \$176,300.00

TRANSPORTATION

Work in progress:

Kaniere Pedestrian/Cyclist Crossing installation and intersection layout change

- The crossing and footpath are installed and awaiting school to start for commissioning.
- The intersection reformation is set to begin within the next 2 weeks. No date has been provided from the Contractor (Henry Adams) as start date is subject to weather.
- Overall the project will be complete when the Kaniere section of road is re-sealed. No start date has been provided from the Contractor (Henry Adams) as the start date is subject to weather.

Old Christchurch Road

- The budget for this project has largely been spent with only minor tidy up to be completed. Sealing has been completed to Van Beeks Farm with tidy up left to be carried out on the remaining 2.3km portion of Section 2.
- The remaining sections of road have been surveyed and some design carried out, this will be completed and costed out in preparation for any further funding opportunities that become available.
- The start date for this project was 25 November 2020, original end date was 30 June 2021. However has been extended to 28 February 2022.
- The Roading Maintenance Contract:
- Westroads were the successful tenderer for this body of work and the new contract officially started on 1 December 2021. Currently no progress report provided to Council by the Contractor.

Up-coming work:

- Resealing of carriageways as well as road marking
- Cauldron Creek Bridge replacement
- Footpath renewals
- Haast Jackson Bay Resillience improvements. (Project scoping design and delivery with delivery likely to extend into next financial year)
- Presently in negotiations with Waka Kotahi NZTA over deferral of the Hau Hau Road Guardrail project for Construction of a School Crossing for Westland High School in Hampden Street. A concept design and investigation has been done for this project by WSP.
