Always use the toilets provided (or your own)



Always use a designated wastewater dump station for your sewage sink water



Use your own facilities for showering and toileting to keep our environment and waterways clean and pollution free




Dispose of your rubbish at the public transfer station in Hokitika. Or surrounding towns rubbish bins. Always do your best to recycle.



Always Park in the areas specifically designated for your type of vehicles



## DRINK TAP WATER



Drink our tap water – it's free, healthy and delicious, and will help reduce single use plastic waste. The RefillNZ website makes it easy to find locations where you can refill your reusable water bottle for free.

## SAY NO TO SINGLE USE TAKE-AWAY CUPS

Say no to single use take-away cups – Sit in or bring your own reusable cup.

## RECYCLE WITH CARE



Put only the right things in recycling bins so it can meet quality standards. Recycling is available at campgrounds, the Hokitika Transfer Station and most surrounding towns have public recycling bins in the township.


# Where can I camp?
