Council Vision

3. WHAKAPUAKITANGA WHAIPĀNGA DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Members need to stand aside from decision-making when a conflict arises between their role as a Member of the Council and any private or other external interest they might have. This note is provided as a reminder to Members to review the matters on the agenda and assess and identify where they may have a pecuniary or other conflict of interest, or where there may be a perception of a conflict of interest.

If a member feels they do have a conflict of interest, they should publicly declare that at the start of the meeting or of the relevant item of business and refrain from participating in the discussion or voting on that item. If a member thinks they may have a conflict of interest, they can seek advice from the Chief Executive or the Group Manager: Corporate Services (preferably before the meeting). It is noted that while members can seek advice the final decision as to whether a conflict exists rests with the member.

Section 46A of the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 states:

- (7) An item that is not on the agenda for a meeting may be dealt with at the meeting if
 - (a) the local authority by resolution so decides, and
 - (b) the presiding member explains at the meeting at a time when it is open to the public, -
 - (i) the reason why the item is not on the agenda; and
 - (ii) the reason why the discussion of the item cannot be delayed until a subsequent meeting.
 - (7A) Where an item is not on the agenda for a meeting, -
 - (a) that item may be discussed at the meeting if -
 - (i) that item is a minor matter relating to the general business of the local authority; and
 - (ii) the presiding member explains at the beginning of the meeting, at a time when it is open to the

public, that the item will be discussed at the meeting; but

(b) No resolution, decision, or recommendation may be made in respect of that item except to refer that item to a subsequent meeting of the local authority for further discussion.

5. NGĀ TĀPAETANGA PRESENTATIONS

• REVIEW OF THE DRAFT MATERIAL FOR PUBLIC INFORMATION & FEEDBACK SESSIONS

John Strange, Civil Engineer, Stantec advised that the purpose of the meeting was to present the draft material for the public information and feedback sessions to the Sub-Committee, and the Sub-Committee to provide comments, adjustments, and endorsement of the way forward, and that copies/PDFs of the material viewed today would be sent out to everyone.

J. Strange further advised that the public information and feedback sessions are an opportunity to keep the Community appraised and involved in the process and a time to receive comments and feedback for the Sub-Committee to evaluate, and reminded the Sub-Committee that the sessions are purely engagement sessions with the community, not consultation. Consultation will happen at some point in the LTP process down the track.

The Project Working Group is having a meeting on Wednesday 11 October 2023, of which West Coast Regional Council, Community & Public Health, Department of Conservation, Department of Internal Affairs, and the National Transition Unit will be a part of. This meeting is being held prior to the public sessions. The purpose of this meeting is to bring them together for an update, and hear any thoughts, concerns, or risks to ensure they are dealt with prior to assessment and preferred options being decided.

- J. Strange advised that on the walls of the meeting room today, there are A1 posters which show the storyline of the project and asked the Sub-Committee to move about the room, follow the storyline provided and raise any questions or queries, thoughts, ideas or comments to add a post-it note to each poster.
- J. Strange advised that there are 2 public information and feedback sessions at the RSA in Hokitika scheduled for:

Saturday 4 November from 10-2pm, and Wednesday 8 November form 4-8pm

It was suggested that Jim Bradley from Stantec provide a short video / slide-show presenting what was done in Hastings at the information sessions. This video would roll over continuously. The Sub-Committee agreed this would be a good addition to the feedback sessions.
