PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE LONG TERM PLAN 2018-28 SUBMISSION HEARING

1 SUMMARY

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is for Council to hear submissions on the Proposed Amendment to the Long Term Plan 2018-28.
- 1.2 This issue arises from the requirements of s 83(b) of the Local Government Act (LGA).
- 1.3 Council seeks to meet its obligations under the Local Government Act 2002 and the achievement of the District Vision adopted by the Council in May 2018, which are set out in the Long Term Plan 2018-28. These are stated on Page 2 of this agenda.
- 1.4 This report concludes by recommending that Council hear submissions to the Proposed Amendment to the Long Term Plan 2018-28, deliberate on the submissions, and agree to return the management of the Museum activity to Council, and decide on a preferred option for the purchase of 41 Weld Street, Hokitika.

2 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 Council agreed to conduct public consultation under s 93A of the LGA in relation to the proposed amendment to the Long Term Plan 2018-28 at an Extraordinary Meeting on 21 August 2020.
- 2.2 The consultation document proposed returning Museum services to Council control from Destination Westland and purchasing the building at 41 Weld

Street, which would house the Museum and Library activities, and possibly tourism information services.

2.3 Public consultation began on Tuesday 25 August 2020 and closed on Thursday 24 September (31 days).

3 CURRENT SITUATION

- 3.1 Council received 78 submissions. Three submitters sent in more than one submission.
- 3.2 A petition with 278 signatures opposing the purchase of 41 Weld Street was received. A number of signatories to the petition have made separate individual submissions.
- 3.3 32 submissions agreed that the Museum function should return to Council and 35 submissions disagreed. 11 submissions did not address this question.
- 3.4 21 submissions agreed that Council should purchase 41 Weld Street, Hokitika and develop the Westland Discovery Centre 'Pakiwaitara' and 50 submissions disagreed.
- 3.5 12 submissions did not state a specific preference regarding the purchase of 41 Weld Street but asked for more information about the financial implications of the purchase to be disclosed to make an informed decision.
- 3.6 Six submitters were in agreement with the concept of Westland Discovery Centre or a Civic hub but had concerns about the purchase of 41 Weld Street.
- 3.7 Three submitters have made more than one submission. One of these submitters is for both the return of the Museum function to Council and for the purchase of 41 Weld Street. Two of the submitters are against Council purchasing 41 Weld Street and did not address the return of the Museum function.
- 3.8 Regarding management of the museum activity, Council is the best place for this function to be situated. The focus of Council is non-commercial and the Museum is better managed internally than externally through Destination Westland.

 - 4.2.1 Hear submissions.
 - 4.2.2 Deliberate on submissions.
 - 4.2.3 Agree to the return of the management of the museum activity to Council.
 - 4.2.4 Make a decision on the preferred option for the purchase of 41 Weld Street, Hokitika.

5 SIGNIFICANCE AND ENGAGEMENT

- 5.1 This matter was assessed as being of high significance under Council's Significance and Engagement Policy.
- 5.2 Council undertook a special consultative process under s 93A, s 93E and s 97 from 25 August to 24 September 2020. This was advertised through public notices in the Hokitika Guardian and Grey Star, on Council's website, in the Westland Matters digital newsletter, on Council's email banner and on Council's Facebook page.

6 ASSESSMENT OF OPTIONS (INCLUDING FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS)

- 6.1 Option 1: Council has an obligation to hear and consider submissions. To do nothing would breach Council's obligations under the LGA.
- 6.2 Option 2: Hearings are an important part of Community consultation and engagement. Council need to understand the Community view on the Proposed Amendment to the LTP 2018-28. There are no financial obligations to carrying out a hearing.

7 PREFERRED OPTION(S) AND REASONS

- 7.1 The preferred option is Option 2:
 - 7.1.1 Hear submissions.
 - 7.1.2 Deliberate on submissions.
 - 7.1.3 Agree to the return of the management of the museum activity to Council.
 - 7.1.4 Make a decision on the preferred option for the purchase of 41 Weld Street, Hokitika.

8 RECOMMENDATION(S)

A) <u>THAT</u> Council receive, hear and deliberate on the submissions.

- B) <u>THAT</u> Council agree to return the management of the Museum activity to Council.
- C) <u>THAT</u> Council decide on the preferred option for the purchase of 41 Weld Street, Hokitika.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment.

The concept of a Discovery Centre is a good move in itself - however the ownership should not lie in the hands of the council or be led by the council executive team that frankly do not have the skills or expertise to successfully develop and run such a vibrant facility.

A council should be a facilitator and not an operator if it is to ensure that ratepayers achieve true value for money.

Council purchasing another building and funding a new hub - is in my opinion not the best use of public funds.

Council will simply engage a number of independent consultants to develop this facility whose knowledge will be based on theoretical presumptions rather than actual experience.

This is a common mistake that is made often throughout NZ when the line between Council's enthusiasm and private enterprise in often blurred and the line crossed in error.

Once the Carnegie building work is completed this is the best location for a Museum and Art Gallery to present the history of our region. The building in itself is historical and once upgraded will be a historical shining light for our region to protect and preserve the stories and hard work of our ancestors and the past. It will then need some excellent marketing, an exceptional customer focused staffing model - and some clever admission revenue and funding solutions to become independently funded.

We must also question- in this new post COVID 19 era -now that traditional thinking is being questioned -how valid is a regional library given the digitalisation of reading material - and how these services can now be better be delivered.?

Could council not save the \$49k lease on the library's current building and bring a digital library into the Visitor Centre and transform the VC into something new, innovative and exciting for the community ...

We should be thinking about how to utilise the VC better to become a guest and local hub for Hokitika.

It is a modern and vibrant space that we could utilise so much better.

Should we now not ask ourselves if an emergency operations facility not be better located at the airport - where we have successfully achieve \$1.5m of PDF funding through the work of Destination Westland and the executive team ..

The management of the museum should remain independent of council if council really wants to deliver value for money to the ratepayers of the region - recruit the very best talent - and achieve a vibrant, flexible and leading edge museum experience.

To be frank the Museum has never been a star attraction - but it has the ability to become one, with the right marketing, structure and people - delivered in the right hands.

Under a council structure it will sadly never achieve its full potential.



Those figures would be higher than that in 2018 - 28 Long Term Plan = I see General rates \$89.7k Targetted rates \$93.6 for Community Halls = so where is that money ???

Museum Function Category is separate (as per listings above) i.e. wages, heating, rental for Carnegie & presumably Drummond Hall etc. all other costs was under a separate funding category to that of Community Halls.. & charged at approx. \$250k – although this should be a lot less considering Museum not open proper and is now under Destination Westland which confuses and makes transparency non existent for a Councillor = so where is that money ???

There should be excess \$\$ in both Community Halls, Museum category and also in Destination Westland bank a/c for Carnegie Building (Drummond Hall) and Museum Function... but much better facts and figures on the Carnegie / Drummond Hall is needed as the points made within the amended Long Term Plan adjustment don't stack up as any good reason for not keeping Museum within Carnegie facility.. it's a very weak consultation document without all information available to those of most interest.



with a personal interest in Hokitika's history and future which I have had since school. I believe Hokitika with care can be made an even more memorable town. My objection to option 2 should be seen as part of this process.

Purchase of 41 Weld Street should not be proceeded with for many reasons. It is a poorly constructed and designed building and to even consider purchase due diligence should be undertaken.

There is no council evidence that this has happened.

There should be thorough analysis, both spatially - floor areas, access, appropriateness etc.

Also physically - climate control, planning, seismic adequacy, adaptability and so on. This is to ensure that what the building provides will suit what the council intends for it

There are no costings or estimates given for its adaptation. There should be.

None of this information has been presented or seems to have been interrogated.

It is the least that could be expected for this proposal.

There is no formal (or even informal) assessment, no comparative costings for alternatives and, it appears little appreciation of the assets council already holds with the Museum and Carnegie Properties. Council's performance and appreciation of the existing Museum and Carnegie Buildings and also history of the the library building management is a disgrace and a litany to be almost laughable if it weren't so tragic. The Hokitika Museum and its collection is one of our nation's significant treasures. Given the extraordinary history of our area it is a huge asset to our town. It needs to be understood and capitalized. It is time to address the Carnegie Museum and Library.

There are actually two separate issues contained in this submission document, the first is whether the Hokitika Museum activity should be returned to Council and the second is whether Council should purchase 41 Weld Street. The future of the Museum should surely not be dependent on the purchase of this building. The purchase of the property should not go ahead for several reasons.

Ratepayers cannot afford to accept responsibility for further debtincurred by Councillors. This debt has ballooned over the past 15 years, but the Westland ratepayer base has not increased to the same extent. The current level of debt is not affordable and any additional borrowings are therefore totally unacceptable. The proposal to purchase appears to have been rushed. Surely any Conditional Sale and Purchase A greement for such a venture should have been entered into with a great deal more time available for a possible purchaser to explore all pros and cons. It is highly unlikely that another purchaser would be forthcoming in the immediate future and I would suggest that the vendor would be happy to have received any conditional offer with a much longer timeline.

A ny and all professional reports on the current state of the building should have been obtained and made available to ratepayers before the request for submissions. The Westland public has long been aware of problems with the leaking roof, and Councillors must surely have also been aware of this, so full disclosure and reports should have been requested and investigated prior to any conditional purchase offer being made. Full plans and costings for the development of the proposed Westland Discovery Centre should have been prepared and made available to the public well before the closing date for submissions. Public meetings should have been held to allow ratepayers to raise concerns with Council members and have questions answered prior to the submission closing date.



Support is conditional on a number of inadequacies in the consultation document being resolved.

The consultation document is short on detail. There is insufficient information and anomalies which preclude informed decision making.

Deficiencies should be addressed and the document re-released for further informed consultation. The process has been unnecessarily rushed. I cannot see buyers lining up to purchase the building given it known deficiencies, so time is not of the essence.

The concept of a civic hub at the entrance to Hokitika is to be applauded and is fully supported.

How this is to be achieved and realistic cost estimates have not been provided, so the true cost of this idea to ratepayers has not been flagged.

Specific inadequacies that need to be addressed are:

- 1. Building assessment and seismic reports are not available to submitters. They need to be to enable informed decision making.
- 2 No conceptual plans have been provided, so we don't know what we are getting. Will all the services fit in the building space while retaining exiting tenants? Do we want a backpackers operation incorporated into a civic hub? Is an Emergency Operations Centre located in a flood prone location logical? If these and other questions have not been considered, how can cost estimates be formulated?
- 3. The consultation document states that the museum fitout can be achieved with funds budgeted in the long term plan at no cost to the ratepayer. It also states in the event that the museum remains in the Carnegie

building a fitout to bring it up to museum standards would result in considerable cost to the rate payer. Logic says one of these statements must be wrong. Which is it to be?

4. The document lacks transparency. Decisions will be made after the consultation period, with information available to councillors which was not available to submitters. Why should this be?

As stated earlier, unless Council knows something that has not been included in the consultation document, time is not of the essence. The consultation process should be put on hold. The building assessment and seismic reports will be available and their contents should be made available to submitters so submissions can be modified if required. Similarly a basic concept of services and layout need to part of a revised consultation document, so submitters can make informed submissions.

The District has no spare funding and should focus on essentials, not embark on new unknown investments. From the consultation document, I am not convinced that the proposed new building would provide sufficient space for improved services from library, museum and visitor centre.

I think it is an advantage having these services spread through town rather than as a 'one-stop and go-no-further-stop' right at the town entrance.

The Carnegie building will need maintenance/restoration regardless, so there is no cost saving to rate payers, and it is the perfect location for a museum.

I do not wish to speak to my submission.

I do not support Option 1 or Option 2. In particular, I do not see why the return of the Museum to Council is dependent on the purchase of 41 Weld St.

I would instead support a hybrid 'Option 3': Return the Museum to Council control but do not purchase 41 Weld St

41 Weld Stis not a viable purchase. What is the seismic rating, and the long term upgrade & maintenance costs, for 41 Weld St? The document does not provide enough information to answer this, but public information provided to date suggests that it is not in good condition, and so is likely to continue to be a financial burden and not fit for purpose. It's likely that the cost will become much more than just the purchase price, also including refit (p4), repair and ongoing upkeep.

Return the Museum to Council. I strongly agree (and have submitted to Council previously) that the Museum should be returned from DW to WDC, mainly on the grounds that it does not suit the 'commercial profit' model.

Museum should retain its LTP budget. To ensure transparency, the transfer should be done along with all the ~\$266,000 budget, at least initially – it should not be a way to reduce the museum funding approved in the LTP or to 'sneakily' divert additional \$\$ to the airport company or other Destination Westland functions, or to the library or 41 Weld Strefit.

Overall, the 'Financial Implications' and 'Impact on Rates' tables on p6 and p7 are not easy to follow and need more explanation.

The statement (p8) that "There will be increased staffing costs for the Museum as a Museum Director will be appointed" does not seem correct, as I understand that the current LTP funding already provides for the currently vacant Director and staff positions.

The diversion of funds to the new building fit-out (note 1 on p6) is also concerning, as the fit-out is for more

than the Museum, and it would cut into the approved budget for the Museum's core functions. Plan for a better Museum. It is not clear if the proposal involves the full shift of the museum (display space, archives and research centre). Changes to the museum space are needed for a number of reasons, but they should be carefully planned, with the long-term security and community benefits of the museum and its collections in mind.

Secure a sustainable site for the Library. There may be advantages in moving the library from its high-cost venue, but 41 Weld St does not seem the ideal place for it. The library is primarily a district community asset and does not need to be positioned for tourists/visitors.

Consider amalgamation of museum, library and iSite elsewhere. I agree that this could have some benefits, but I'm not convinced that it is best done by purchasing 41 Weld St. The museum's collections and the library's books need to be in secure and watertight buildings.

No more meeting rooms. WDC does not need to set up yet another public meeting room, which is what 41 Weld St (or a ground floor WDC Chambers) would become in part. The town has more than enough community meeting rooms already and WDC could contribute to their viability by hiring them out when needed, rather than competing with them. The RSA and Regent Theatre are two such places that might benefit from such WDC support.

Use existing buildings in Hokitika for the [alternative] CD EOC. The Civil Defence EOC can be placed somewhere like the RSA, or St Johns, or Boys Brigade Hall, or the airport. A site so close to the WDC EOC is not a true 'alternative site' and is not a sensible approach. If the WDC building is unusable (eg due to flooding or quake damage) then 41 Weld St might well be too. If 41 Weld St is indeed a seismic risk, it is not a suitable EOC.

Secure the Carnegie Building. Despite assurances, I believe that the proposal risks the loss or diversion of potential funding for the Carnegie Building.

What is the "Hokitika CBD Master Plan"? (referred to on p8). It doesn't seem to be on the WDC website, and without it I'm unable to judge how this proposal fits in to the Plan.

A solution to all the matters raised in the consultation document could look like this.

- 1. Return the Museum to Council (for the reasons outlined in the consultation document) along with its full LTP budget allocation, and develop a plan for better arrangements for the museum facilities.
- 2 Investigate amalgamation of the museum, library and iSite, as much as possible within existing WDC-owned buildings, including the Carnegie Building.
- 3. Set up the [alternative] EOC in another existing location such as the RSA building, St Johns, Boys Brigade hall, or the airport.
- 4. Use the RSA as the Council's main public meeting area in cases when the Council chambers are unsuitable, or if a new Council chambers is necessary, then set up in the bottom floor (maybe in the west end if feasible?) of the current Council building.
- 5. Maintain the existing WDC offices and the pool as important public spaces at the entrance to the town CBD.

I feel vital information regarding projected costs for alterations that would be needed in order for the Mountain Jade building to meet the suggested requirements of Council have not been supplied in order for ratepayers to make an informed decision. A fter a visual inspection of the building yesterday I noted that the external doors were a mere 1.9 meters in height. A domestic door height is normally 1.980. The fire regulations regarding egress from buildings in a commercial or Public building through doorways, dictates a minimum height of 2.1 meters. The doors that fail to meet the code are those leading into the two leased shops, the main entrance to the Jade shop, the Backpackers and the Clock tower Cafe.

A problem I can see arising from this is that if the door openings are to be increased by 200mm that would compromise the structural integrity of the concrete lintels above the doors and subsequently the strong possibility that the building would fail to meet the required earthquake standards. To remediate this situation could well be extremely costly and lead to an unexpected costly outcome for ratepayers. I am also concerned about the "dig out" for the buildings foundations and recall the NZRS fuel tanks being dug out but my recollection of the depth of the excavation and the quality of the ground prior to backfilling should be investigated in order to make an informed decision on the risk of liquefaction.

I disagree with Council spending money on anything related to Tourism that surely should be left to the private sector especially in the face of a looming financial crisis. It is clear by the actions since the start of the Covoid pandemic that commercial tourism operators have either consolidated their businesses or gone into hibernation. Clearly this is not a time to be gambling with Rate Payer money ,and be lured by low interest rates . a debt is still a debt . I would like to see the function of the I site closed. It is in no way cost effective to Rate Payers. I would have much rather seen the 3million allocated to the pool upgrade being used instead to build a new Council owned Library. A facility that receives a deservedly high satisfaction rating from users. A new library would have removed the expensive rent Council pays at present and could also have incorporated a comms room for Civil Defence.

The only information in the public domain concerning the current state of the building suggests that there are considerable earthquake strengthening requirements, and considerable structural repairs required before rthe building could be considered a suitable environment to house a Museum Collection and staff.

My preference therefore would be that the Museum stays at it's current location and work is completed on the Carnegie restrengthening and work undertaken to rebuild the Drummond Hall complex to Museum Standard.
