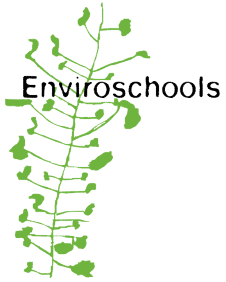

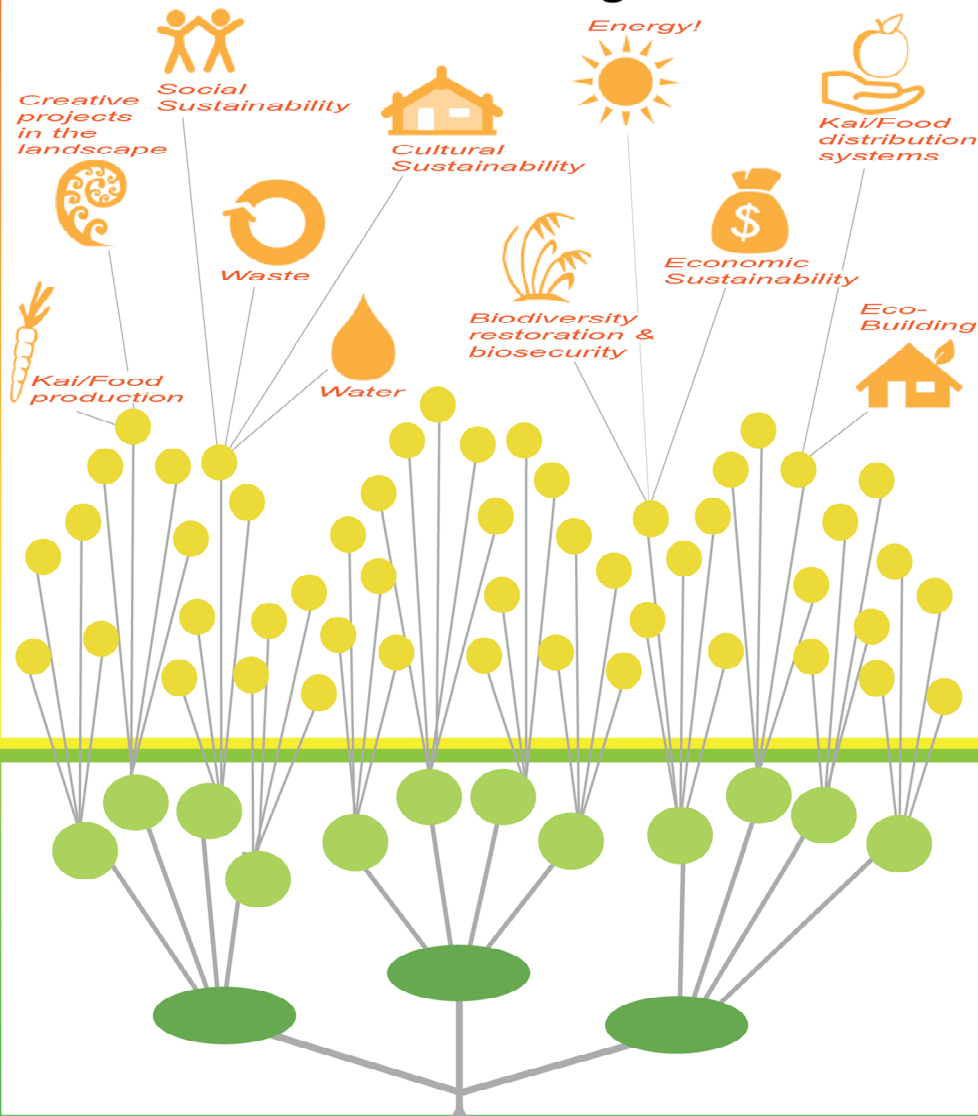


Enviroschools has nationwide reach

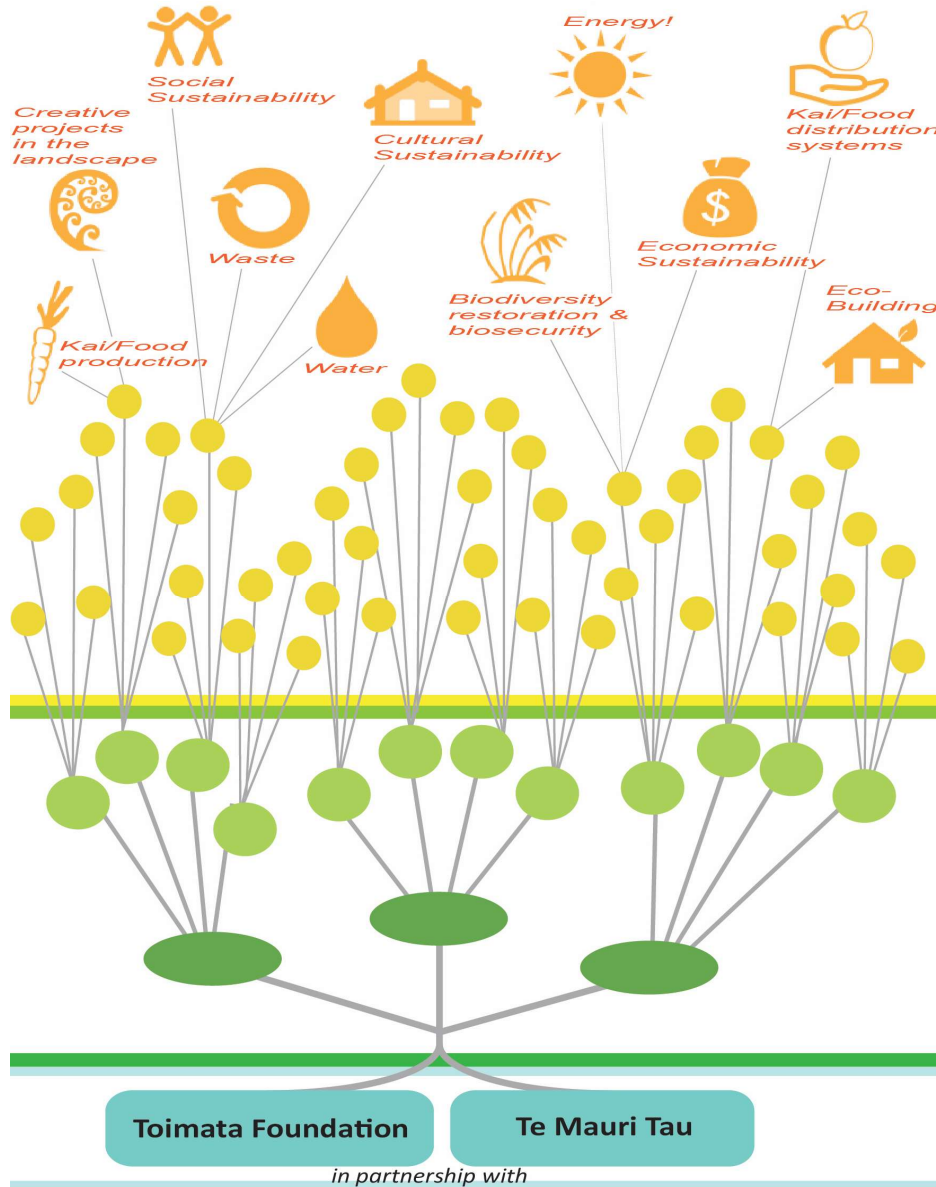

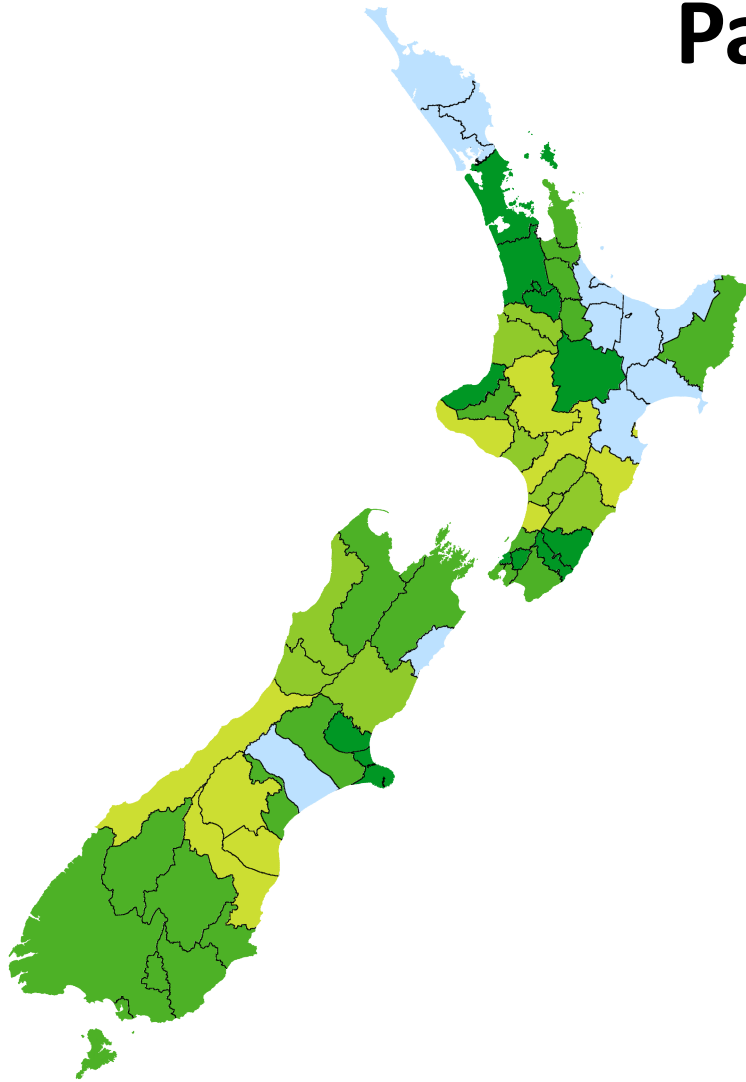

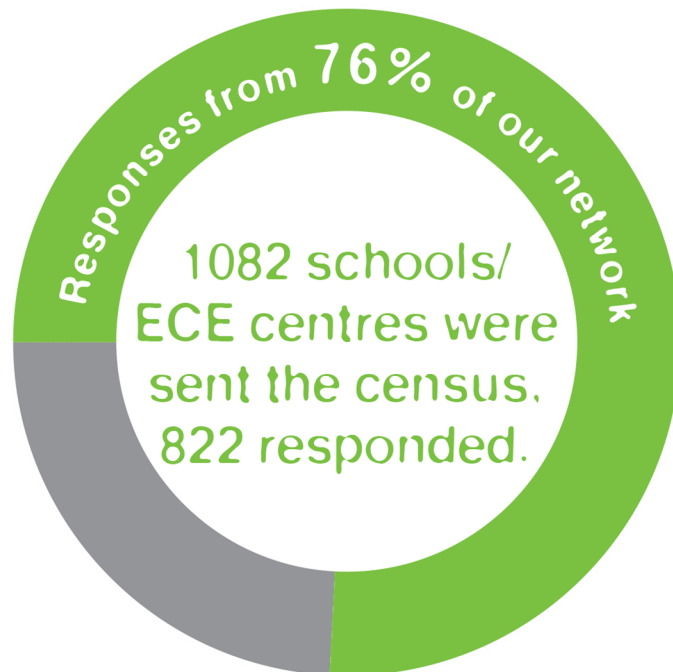

- A comprehensive, nationwide survey sent to **1082 Enviroschools** in October 2017



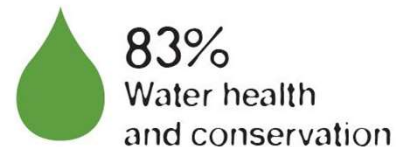
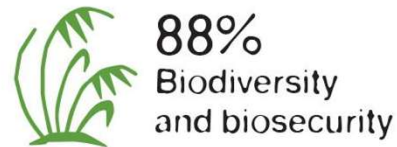
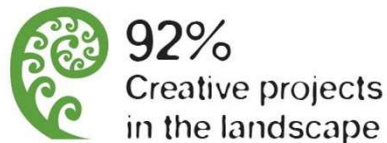
Overview of the 2017 results

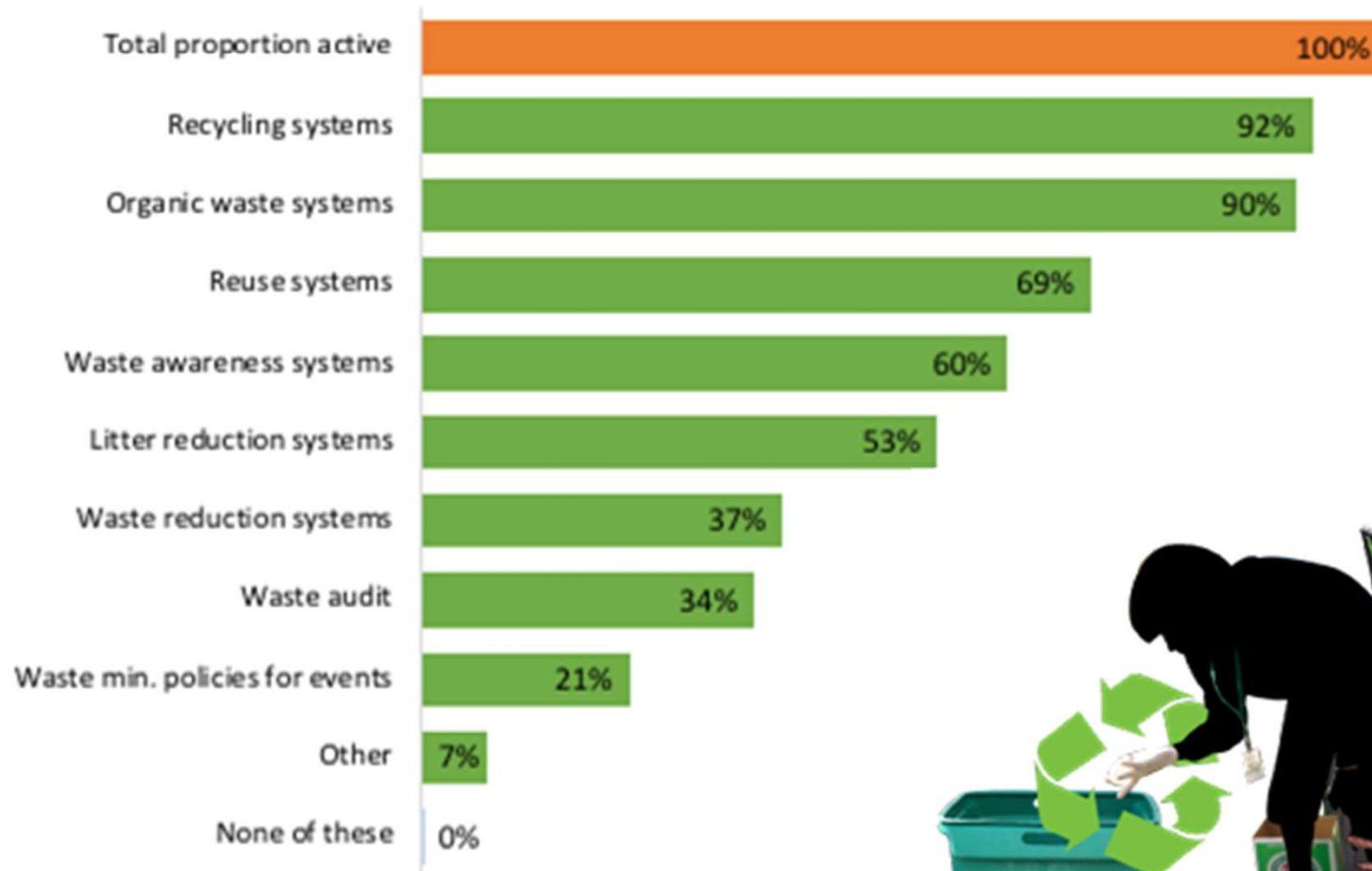

Swan Plants \$2 each

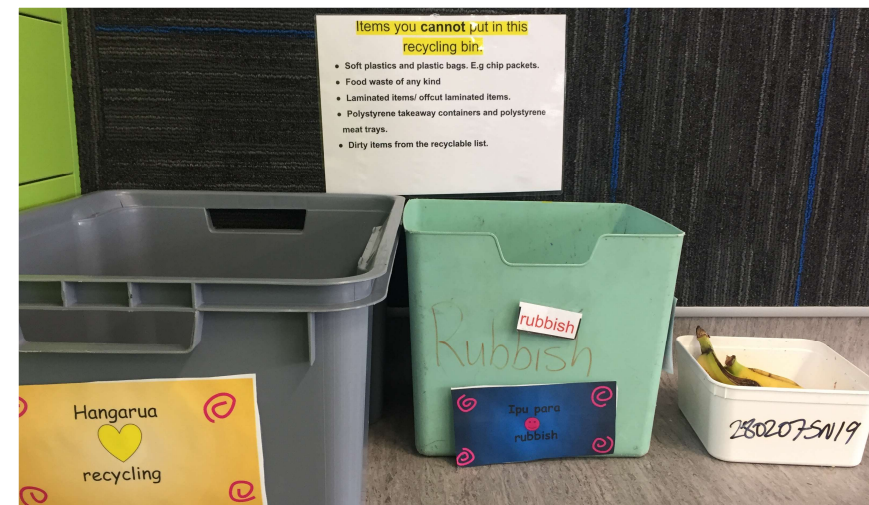


We are selling swan plants to help conserve these beautiful creatures and raise money for a greenhouse for our gardens.

Items you cannot put in this recycling bin.

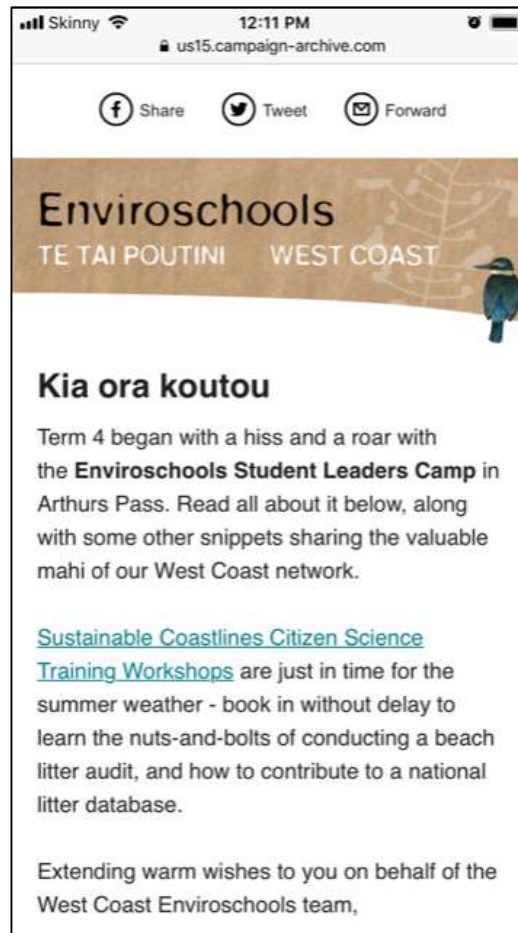
- Soft plastics and plastic bags. E.g chip packets.

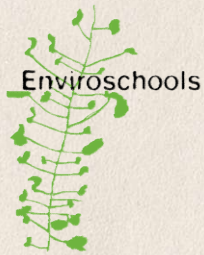
